Obituaries

Alan J. Nevins, DDS – Dr. Alan Nevins passed away on April 2, 2023 at the age of 78. Dr. Nevins practiced endodontics in Southampton NY. He completed dental school at New York University in 1969, served in the dental corps as a Captain in the US Air Force until 1971, completed an endodontic residency at Nassau County Medical Center in 1975, and became board certified in 1980. Dr. Nevins held many academic positions including as a clinical assistant professor at Stony Brook University from 1989-1997. Dr. Nevins was a 53-year member of the ADA.

Raymond Gary Dennison, DDS – Dr. Dennison, age 86, passed away on March 21, 2023. Dr. Dennison graduated from New York University dental school in 1962, retired in 2000, and had been an ADA member for 61 years.



Dear Colleagues,

As we approach the halfway point in my presidency, we are seeing many positive legislative actions underway. My role as Chair of Governmental Af-



fairs, representing the profession of Dentistry in Washington DC and Albany, and advocating for you, the dentists, in our community has been extremely educational and rewarding. Before taking on this role, I had little knowledge of what went on behind the scenes with advocacy. Speaking to our government and state representatives about issues with workforce shortages, the DOCS act, administration of vaccinations by our profession, insurance accountability with establishing medical loss ratios for dental insurances and a Non-Covered Services Bill, among others has been extremely rewarding, knowing that we are being listened to. Many of these bills are being worked on and passed through legislative chains with full bipartisan support.

Last month, Senate Insurance Chair Neil Breslin introduced S7013, which would create a dental-specific MLR (medical loss ratio) of 82% and ensure that a minimum amount of the premiums are spent on patient care. This Bill would be set to take effect January 1, 2024. Under current law, health insurance companies offering small group and individual products must meet a medical loss ratio of 82%, which requires that at least 82% of every premium dollar be spent on patient care. There is currently no comparable MLR requirement for dental insurance products. This bill would protect the consumers by establishing an MLR that parallels existing MLR requirements for health insurance products.

In addition, Senate Higher Education Chair, Toby Stavinsky introduced an amendment to education law with two vaccination bills that we have been advocating for. These vaccinations include the administration of vaccinations against human papillomavirus, influenza and COVID vaccinations, and any vaccinations related to a public health emergency. Since the authorizing Executive Order expired in June 2021, dentists are no longer permitted to administer the above vaccinations. Every dentist in New York must have a four-year undergraduate degree, complete four years of dental school, complete a one-year residency program, and pass a National Dental Board examination. Dentists can administer Novocaine and other injectable medications. From a clinical perspective, dentists are certainly just as or more qualified to administer vaccinations as other professionals, such as pharmacists, nurses, physician assistants, and other health paraprofessionals currently authorized to administer vaccinations.

Furthermore, dentists frequently communicate with primary care professionals and other medical professionals to provide holistic care around a patient. This is particularly true where the dentist works in or with a federally qualified health clinic (FQHC). Allowing our profession to administer vaccinations provides patients with immediate access. Dentists can address questions and, when appropriate, administer vaccinations when a patient is already at a medical appointment. This saves the patient from having to go somewhere else, take additional time off from work or school and/or find someone to take care of a family member.

Many other legislative proposals are being worked on and are coming down the governmental pipelines. Without the strong support and strong advocacy from the ADA and NYS-DA, we would not see these positive changes helping our profession fight and win major battles with insurance reform and protecting our ability to work as DOCTORS! Stay tuned and have a great summer!

Predictable Endodontic Pathways What You Need to Know and How to Perform It

This all-day lecture session will address endodontics from both an advanced perspective and from a restorative point of view. The key in making endodontics profitable is being able to do cases consistently well and in manner that leads directly to the final restoration. Doing a root canal but destroying the tooth in the process does not achieve anything! In this presentation, Dr. Koch will emphasize the concept of linking endodontics with restorative dentistry and will demonstrate how important it is to be "living in the world of a constant taper" when performing rotary instrumentation. A completely intuitive way of instrumenting a root canal (the Blend Technique) will also be discussed, as well as an update on bioceramic technology. Direct pulp caps, indirect pulp caps, and perforation repair will also be fully discussed.

In addition to advanced concepts, basic issues such as attaining profound anesthesia, practical diagnosis and smart case selection will all be addressed. Additionally, a completely drill-free post system will be introduced as well as a new digital viewing device (EZscope). As is her reputation, Dr. Koch will keep the day fast paced and moving briskly.

Objectives - Upon completion, the participant shall be able to comprehend the endo-restorative relationship and describe the latest techniques used to achieve predictable success.

Upon completion, the participant will be able to evaluate the changing paradigm in endodontics and realize that adult pulp caps potentially have a place in select endodontic cases.

Upon completion, the participant will have a more thorough understanding of the many virtues of a true bioceramic cement and hydraulic condensation.

Upon completion, the participant will understand what quality endodontics can do for their patient and where endodontics fits into the overall treatment plan.

Bio: Anne L. Koch, D.M.D. - Dr. Koch received both her DMD and Certificate in Endodontics from the University of Pennsylvania. She is also the founder and past Director of the Postdoctoral Program in Endodontics at the Harvard School of Dental Medicine. Following her clinical and academic career, Annie formed her own successful technology and development company, Real World Endo, of which she was CEO and President. Dr. Koch is the holder of multiple patents. The author of more than one hundred and fifty articles in her prior specialty field, Dr. Koch has presented more than one thousand lectures worldwide. Dr. Koch is an active member of the ADA, AAE, MDS, and BDDS. Dr. Koch maintains a faculty position at PENN (Department of Endodontics) as well as serving as a Senior Fellow with Penn Medicine. She also is a member of the Board of Overseers for the University of Pennsylvania School of Dental Medicine.

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS 2024

The Suffolk County Dental Society's Nominating Committee will meet at the end of August to screen and select candidates for elective office at the local, state and national levels.

To be eligible for any elective office a member must have served on our governing Board of Directors for at least three of the past five years. Other restrictions may apply for state and national positions. Nominations are invited for the following positions for 2024, to be considered this summer.

President: Dr. Steven Feigelson (as President-Elect 2023, automatically advances to the position of President)

President-Elect: Dr. William Bast

Vice President: Dr. Natalia Elson

Secretary: (one-year term - usually advances through the other officer positions).

Treasurer: Note - this is a two-year term. (Dr. John Guariglia completes his 1st year of his 3rd term at the end of 2023; he has one year left on his 3rd and final term).

NYSDA Delegates:

Three open NYSDA (4-year term) Delegate positions. Seven open NYSDA Alternate-Delegate positions. NYSDA Alternate-Delegate term is 1 year.

ADA Delegates:

One open ADA Delegate position. The ADA Delegate is a 3-year term with a maximum of 3 terms. One open ADA Alternate-Delegate position. The ADA Alternate-Delegate term is 1 year.

Second letter from the ADA Trustee to NYSDA Districts - April 2023-Trustee's Corner

As everyone already knows, there is not a person out there who is enjoying the spring weather better than a citizen of Western New York. After a very difficult and at times dangerous winter, we are happy to experience the annual change of season. I hope all our members have had a successful first part of the year and wish for continued blessings to you and your families.

I want to begin this segment of my letter to you with the issue of membership. Unfortunately, membership in the ADA, and concurrently in our constituents and components, has been dropping for a number of years. At the present time, ADA membership is 57% of active and retired dentists. There has been a steady decline since 2007, with some up and down years before then. I firmly believe this is a multifactorial problem which requires a variety of solutions. I also believe there are component, state, and national answers. Many of our local components in New York are hard at work on initiatives tailored for their unique district needs or that can be shared with other components. Our constituent, New York, has developed a mentoring program under the leadership of our president, Dr. Jim Galati. The ADA is working on a variety of programs with dental schools (Signing Day, Lunch and Learns) and New Dentists (ADAPT, career path and wellness support) to promote membership with the latest generation of our profession. A culture of inclusion is being fostered at all levels of the Tripartite to help make prospective members of all backgrounds feel welcomed into our organization. It's going to take all of us to promote the advantages and benefits of membership to keep our organization and voice strong in the future. Membership is critical to the success and relevance of the American Dental Association. At the same time, I would like to thank each and every one of you for your many years of membership and your contributions to Organized Dentistry.

I attended the ADA Board of Trustee meeting from April 2nd through April 4th in Chicago. The beginning of the meeting was an evening social gathering with the New Dentist Committee, followed by a collaborative meeting the next morning. Discussions involved the tough issues confronting dentistry today, including the membership question. Many of the New Dentists pointed out some of the strengths and weaknesses they see in the American Dental Association. Strengths include advocacy at the federal and state level, continuing education, and the Strategic Forecasting Committee. Areas of improvement begin with communication to members, especially pursuant to social media. They also believe the ADA is taking steps to improve with key hirings of experts in this area. The ADA believes members will see better results in the very near future.

Also on the agenda, a group of DSO executives and the executive director of the ADSO organization met with the Board of Trustees for an open discussion on the current landscape of delivery of dental care. Each of the attendees discussed their background and history, delineated areas of agreement with the ADA, as well as offered examples of future opportunities for cooperation. Such opportunities could include the sharing of analytical data, solutions to workforce shortages, and collaborating on interprofessional education. A good discussion ensued on different modalities of patient care in dentistry and how there are many viable avenues for the future. It was agreed by all parties that it is in the best interest of dentistry to keep this conversation going, continue to find areas of common ground, and attempt to resolve disagreements.

As many of you know, the ADA is a membership organization that has a dental research entity, the American Dental Association Science Research Institute (ADASRI). The ADA Board recently approved switching ADASRI to operate as a 501(c)(3), a change from its former status as a 501(c)(6) LLC. Under the ADASRI Operating Agreement, ADASRI has a 10-member Board of Directors, the appointment of each of whom is approved by the ADA. Currently, it has 44 employees with labs located in Maryland as well as the ADA building in Chicago. Much of the testing of the products to be considered for the ADA Seal of Acceptance takes place in the ADASRI labs in the ADA building. The ADA is the only dental membership organization in the world that has a scientific research arm directly affiliated with it. It has been very successful since its inception in 2018. In 2022, it had 753 citations, 25 peer-reviewed published manuscripts, and 27 abstracts presented. It is involved in applied research (AR), evidence synthesis and translational research (ESTR), as well as innovation and technology research (ITR). You will see many scientific articles in JADA and many other distinguished journals originating from ADASRI.

My next written correspondence with you will be in the fall before the ADA's annual meeting in October in Orlando, Florida. In the meantime, the New York State Dental Association will be gathering in Saratoga Springs, New York, for its annual meeting from June 2nd to June 4th. The House of Delegates will meet to debate and decide on a group of resolutions presented to it by component societies, the NYSDA Board of Trustees, NYSDA councils, and individual members. There will also be two contested elections for Speaker of the House and Secretary-Treasurer. As you know, the House of Delegates is the supreme body of the New York State Dental Association.
