Conservative Prosthodontics: Cost to Benefit Ratio

Course Description: This lecture will present clinical cases that demonstrate treatment protocols based on cost-to-benefit ratio without compromising long-term treatment.

Bio: Dr. Appelbaum earned his DDS degree from New York University College of Dentistry in 1974. He did his general practice residency at the French and Polyclinic hospital NYC. His specialty training in prosthodontics was completed at the Veterans Administration Hospital Buffalo New York and at the University of Buffalo School of Dentistry department of prosthodontics in 1977.

Marc has taught at Rutgers School of Dental Medicine in the postgraduate prosthodontic program as an Associate Clinical Professor for the past twenty years and continues to maintain this academic affiliation. He is a Fellow in the Greater New York Academy of Prosthodontics, Fellow American College of Dentists, Fellow International College of Dentists. Dr Appelbaum has published 22 articles in refereed journals and a chapter in a textbook.

Dr. Appelbaum maintained a practice limited to prosthodontics in Morristown NJ from 1977 to 2018. He was an attending at Morristown Memorial Hospital department of dentistry from 1978-2017. He has been practicing in Santa Fe since 2018.
