We recognize that each practice has its own nuances and those differences are what makes the practice of dentistry so unique. However ,we ask for your cooperation during these uncharged waters. Please, use good judgement in only seeing true emergencies that if not cared for would cause severe harm to the patient or increase the load on local hospitals and emergency centers.

In accordance with state and federal guidelines, the **NC Dental Society has decided to cancel this year's Annual Session** in May in Myrtle Beach.

- You will receive an email in the next 30 days indicating that your registration fee
  has been refunded
- If your room was part of the NCDS room block, your reservation will be automatically canceled. Kingston Resorts will send out confirmation emails.
