**Comprehensive Interdisciplinary Dentistry: Outcome-Based Treatment presented by Dr. Robert Winter**

Effective communication and collaboration between members of the interdisciplinary dental team is essential to achieving the goals established for treatment. It is crucial that each member understands the modalities other team members use to accomplish various patient outcomes.

A comprehensive assessment establishing the diagnosis and development of the treatment plan, including possible alternatives, is essential to achieving an outcome that develops appropriate occlusion and function, and meets the esthetic expectations of the patient.

A facially generated treatment-planning model that emphasizes periodontal considerations will be presented. This model will be used to guide the development of the treatment plan and determine the periodontal, implant and restorative procedures necessary to meet the desired patient-centered outcomes.

Learning objectives:

- Participants will have an enhanced awareness of essential information that should be communicated during a collaborative treatment planning process.
- Participants will understand how they can idealize restorative treatment outcomes by altering the tissue either apically or coronally and restoring implants.
- Participants will recognize when to phase or sequence periodontal-restorative procedures.
- Participants will understand the rationale for outcome-based preparation design and material selection in the esthetic zone.

### About the Speaker

Dr. Winter is one of the most prolific **prosthodontics and ceramists in the world**. Dr. Robert Winter is a member of the Spear resident faculty, teaching seminars, workshops, and producing clinical and technical online content. His comprehensive knowledge, skill, and expertise, along with his unique teaching and mentoring style, enable Spear dentists to understand the interdependence between laboratory procedures, treatment planning, restorative techniques and materials. He is also a member of the Spear faculty practice.

Dr. Winter has taught more than 700 didactic, clinical, and technical courses in more than 40 countries. For the past 31 years, he has maintained a private practice limited to prosthodontics, and currently practices in Newport Beach, Calif., and Dallas, Texas. He has owned and operated a dental laboratory since starting his career, and is the founder of The Winter Laboratory. As both a prosthodontist and master dental technician, he has the unique ability to develop and execute treatment plans for complex diagnoses, which produce highly esthetic and functional outcomes for patients. He is actively involved in research and product development pertaining to new dental materials and products. He was a co-developer of Ivoclar-Vivadent's IPS d.SIGN® ceramic, and the Winter Series of diamond burs for Brasseler USA. In 1991, he was the second recipient of the Gordon Christensen Lecturer Recognition Award for Excellence in Restorative Education, and named Marquette University School of Dentistry Distinguished Alumni of the Year in 2005.

Dr. Winter is a member of the graduate prosthodontics faculty at the University of Washington and the University of Southern California, and is on faculty at Case Western Reserve University School of Dental Medicine and Midwestern University. He has published numerous articles, and sits on the advisory boards for the Journal of Esthetic and Restorative Dentistry and The International Journal of Periodontics & Restorative Dentistry. Dr. Winter is current president of the American Academy of Esthetic Dentistry. He is a member of the American Academy of Restorative Dentistry, the American College of Prosthodontists, the American Dental Association and the California Dental Association. Dr. Winter graduated in 1981 from Marquette University School of Dentistry, and completed his prosthodontic specialty residency at the VA Medical Center in Milwaukee, WI in 1983.

During the training, actual case studies of OSHA inspections and lessons learned from these visits will be reviewed. Additional topics will include measures to reduce the likelihood of a bloodborne exposure, the post exposure process, and a review of the Hazard Communication Standard. The requirements of the Privacy and Security will be discussed and tools will be provided to assist with the management of a breach.
