





Digital Dentistry – Digital Implants

In today's dental practice, there is no excuse for an implant being anywhere other than the perfect position. While free-hand implant placement can provide excellent results, it requires a much longer learning curve and unnecessary stress. Now that CBCT are ubiquitous, doctors can have far greater control over the surgical process and yield consistently ideal results. In the past, this process required outside planning services and came at a high cost. However, there are now excellent free software options and affordable, easy to use 3D printers that allow doctors to complete the whole process in house. By embracing this workflow, you'll be able to design and fabricate your own surgical guides for less than \$20 and a 10 minute investment of time. This course will teach the entire workflow of guided surgery from diagnosis to final restoration of the implant. Along the way, we will show various technologies that are available and how to integrate them into your practice.

The ancient technique of placing an implant where the bone is, is dead and gone in most cases. The “crown down approach” or restoratively driven approach has been shown to be the best approach. Thus, Bone grafting is almost a requisite for any patient that needs a tooth removed or an implant placed. As with any surgery or procedure the success and outcomes are based on the biologic principles and limitations involved. Therefore, we will discuss the biology of bone grafts to give us a foundation to build upon. There are almost seemingly endless different grafting techniques and materials available for bone grafting. In understanding the biology of these materials and a review of the literature we can narrow down the different products that one needs to keep on hand to provide bone grafting options. We will briefly discuss some different grafting techniques and when to refer.

- Recommendations on material selection and what I have found works best in my hands.
- Discuss the armamentarium involved with different procedures and techniques.


