- Applying pit and fissure sealants
- Applying topical anticariogenic agents
- Placing retraction cords for crown impressions

Coronal Polishing for Restorative and Orthodontic Assistants 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., Friday, October 22, 2021

As required by the WV Board of Dentistry, dental assistants who have two years and at least 3,000 hours of clinical experience in a dental office as attested to by their supervising dentist and who have completed either the restorative or orthodontic expanded duties course, or both, may perform supragingival and coronal polishing on children under 21 years of age using a slow-speed hand piece with a rubber cup under direct supervision of a dentist after successfully completing this course and examination. Learning objectives include:

- Review of patient medical history to determine any contraindications;
- Review of infection control, standard precautions and transfer of diseases;
- Dental tissues surrounding the teeth and dental anatomy and nomenclature;
- Rationale for performing coronal polishing and selective polishing theory;
- Beneficial and adverse effects of coronal polishing;
- Definition of plaque, types of stain, calculus, and related terminology and topics;
- Principles of selecting abrasive and polishing agents and their effects on structures and materials;
- Types of equipment and materials used and proper maintenance of equipment;
- Correct techniques for coronal polishing;
- Procedures to follow in case of medical emergencies; and
- Dental ethics and legal understanding of procedures allowed by each dental team member.

After completing this course including passing an exam by the assistant, the supervising dentist shall personally observe the following successful tasks by the dental assistants on five separate patients; identifying calculus, plaque, intrinsic and extrinsic stains; selection of appropriate abrasive and polishing agents; polishing exposed surfaces of the teeth; evaluate the extent of plaque and stain removal; and adherence to infection control protocols.

Successful completion requires passing an exam of at least 75% at conclusion of the course.
