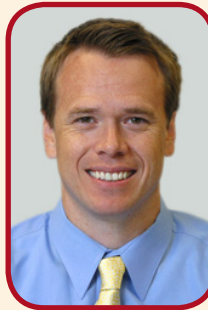

Periodontics and Implants: What We Teach Today (5CE)

This program will focus on different aspects of periodontics and implant therapy and how we teach students at the university. We will review periodontal disease and basics of treatment, how we treat gingival recession, our surgical protocol for implants and how we care for implants after placement. A better understating of these topics will lead to better communication and treatment planning between generalists and specialists and better outcomes for our patients.

Course Objectives:

- Review of Periodontal Disease:** What to look for, how to treat, when referrals should be made and why we don't use lasers (yet?)
- Implant Maintenance:** What we're teaching, what instruments to use, how to treat peri-implantitis and why we don't use lasers (yet?)
- Soft Tissue Grafting:** Different types of grafts, indications for different grafts, how to treat grafting today and which type is better?
- Implants:** How we teach implants today, use of CBCTs and surgical guides, and what to do if the guide doesn't fit?
